Dear Earlham Community

We had a good warm week with our boilers working well.

The NSPCC visited and led assemblies and workshops to inform children about CHILDLINE which is the dedicated helpline just for children who are experiencing stress from difficulties. This could be as a result of abuse or trauma in their lives. The children learnt about their rights (to speak out when experiencing difficulty); who they can turn to for help (trusted adults); what is abuse (neglect; physical; emotional and sexual) and how childline can help.

This was all expertly explained in an age appropriate manner.

The Student Council confirmed to me that although the subject matter was very serious, they felt that the NSPCC visit was extremely helpful and beneficial.

At Earlham Primary, we are fortunate in that children are friendly, kind and exist harmoniously. Staff are dedicated and caring and follow up issues. However, as with any school community, there are issues that need to be addressed and resolved. Sometimes we have playground squabbles or children irritating/bothering other children. To this end we have a special department - The Marshmallow Chrysalis Centre - staffed by Ms Shirley and Mr Leslie. Their job is to mentor children to cope with difficulties and to resolve issues caused by inappropriate or incorrect behaviour. They focus on stopping bullying or sorting it out if it is becoming an issue. They work at this with dedication and skill and we never let an issue go without addressing it to aim for the best outcome for all.

I want you to feel confident about knowing who to speak to when an issue arises.

We have included an information table with the newsletter and I trust that this will give you the confidence to know who to speak to at our school so that we can work in partnership to get the best outcomes for our children.

We aim for our school to be well - led at every level with a positive impact for every member of our Earlham Community
